# **University-Sponsored Fellowships & Scholarships**

### **GRADUATE RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP**

The Graduate Research Fellowship (GRF) is a one-year, non-renewable award by the University of Utah <u>Graduate School</u>. To be eligible, you must be a current, full-time Ph.D. student. In order for an awardee to accept the GRF, s/he must have satisfactorily passed all preliminary and qualifying examinations prior to the previous Fall Semester. Fellows are expected to be engaged in full-time research or creative work during the academic year of the fellowship. Both domestic and international graduate students are eligible to apply.

The department may only nominate 2 students, who then compete on the University level to receive the fellowship.

Interested students must submit the completed application to the Scholarship and Fellowship Committee by December 15 for departmental nomination.

Award amount: \$15,000 + tuition waiver

Award duration: one year, not renewable
